General Crime is a broad category of offenses and includes property crimes and crimes against persons including, but not limited to:

- Victims of Impaired Drivers
- Bias/Hate Crimes
- Vandalism

CORNERSTONE'S GENERAL CRIME VICTIM SERVICES

General Crime Victim Services Advocates assist individuals by explaining victims' statutory rights, offering emotional support, addressing safety concerns, offering resources and referrals, providing criminal and civil legal advocacy, assisting with financial needs and filing Harassment Restraining Orders.

Advocates work out of the Minneapolis office and are available over the phone or for walk-in support. Our services are free of charge; conversations with Cornerstone's advocates are confidential. It is not necessary to contact law enforcement or have an open criminal investigation to access our services.

CRIME VICTIM RIGHTS

- Crime victims have the right to be notified.
- Crime victims have the right to protection from harm.
- Crime victims have the right to participate in prosecution.
- Crime victims have the right to apply for financial assistance.

TRAININGS AND PRESENTATIONS IN THE COMMUNITY

Cornerstone staff also provide training and outreach in the community through a trauma-informed lens on the nature of victimization and causes and consequences of victimization. Staff can also provide additional information about our comprehensive services for individuals who have experienced domestic violence and sexual violence.
